"Green Claims" are claims for damages made against culprits and their insurers for the cost to repair damage to the highway asset and "Red Claims" are those claims made against the highway authority.

Note these lengths includes roads with loops and junction forks added, not just end to end, these have been taken from the level 3 gazetteer ESU link coordinates added together from the start and finish on the centre of the each junction (column A) from this an estimate I have calculated for the real length (Column B). Hopefully this is a more accurate representation of the real network length maintained by us. Also note some roads may include some private sections.
