



Healthy Streets Everyday

Service Level Agreement - London Borough of Barnet

1. Introduction

The London Borough of Islington in partnership with the City of London, City of Westminster, London Boroughs of Barnet, Ealing, Greenwich, Hackney, Hammersmith and Fulham, Haringey, Lambeth, Lewisham, Merton, Tower Hamlets, Waltham Forest, Wandsworth, the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and Cross River Partnership (CRP) have been awarded £875,000 from Round 3 of the Mayor's Air Quality Fund. Funding is provided for project delivery from June 2019 to March 2022. Participating boroughs/partners have also agreed to provide match-funding contributions of £2,365,000 to make a total project budget of £3,240,000.

Healthy Streets Everyday aims to support and extend action with the 16 participating boroughs and will deliver six key workstreams:

- Streetscape improvements
- New traffic regulations to make streets more pedestrian-friendly
- 250 car-free events, including on annual Car Free Day (22nd September 2019)
- Guidance on how to create Healthy Streets Everyday
- A communications framework and materials
- · Evaluation and monitoring of project interventions.
