456765	It has now been a year (3 May 2019) since I submitted the application for the Modification Order and I have heard nothing from you or any of your colleagues to indicate that any action has been taken, even though this was the only application on the register. Therefore, if I do not hear from you by 3 June, I will follow your suggestion that I put the case to the Secretary of State for the Environment	<p>Thank you for your email. We have had initial contact from the planning inspectorate about this matter, so understand that you have applied to the Secretary of State.</p> <p>We are sorry it is taking a long time to progress your application. Although, as you note, this is the only application on the register, the staff who would normally progress it also carry out a range of other duties unrelated to this work, and these have had an impact over the course of the year.</p> <p>To address this, we are taking steps to identify other staff resources who would be able to support the work needed in relation to your of your application, and hope this will soon allow this to progress at a faster pace.</p>

This matter has dragged on for 6 months since our meeting on-site to discuss and establish the health and safety and right of way issues and whose responsibility it is. I believe you confirmed to [redacted] that it is definitely owned by highways. // Why have the issues not been addressed by you the initial response that highways will repair the right of way if and when required, is nonsense you have witnessed the state of the land back in December you have the photographs and notes you took at the time yet nothing has been done regarding these problems (health and safety of the public and rights of way) // You have not responded to my last email with any plan of action to repair the land and confirm our rights of way which I requested. How many more months do we have to wait this is not good enough. // Also, I would bring to your attention which I believe we did discuss at the site meeting although not entirely sure about that, there is a leaking water main on the corner of your land this has been leaking possibly for a year or more and this leak makes the pavement slippery with green slime in the dry weather and in the winter ice forms it is only a matter of time before someone slips over I presume the council has public liability on this land?</p>	<p>Thank you for your further emails of 6 and 8 June 2020 regarding the back of footway area on Colin Close. // At the time of our site meeting my intention was to resurface the back of footway area once we had commenced the 2020/21 financial year. However, following receipt of your email on 4 May 2020, I consulted the Interim Lead Commissioner for Highways and the Operations Director for Re Highways on this matter, and they confirmed that no remedial works will be undertaken, which I informed you of in my email response of 29 May 2020. // I can confirm that the area is public highway and because of this, I did commit to carrying out a highways safety inspection of this area to identify intervention level defects. As I am sure you son has informed you, the highways safety inspector for the area [redacted] attended site last Thursday 2 July 2020 and spoke to your son [redacted]. [The inspector] confirmed that there are no intervention level defects present in the gravel area, nor is there a leaking water main, but there was some run off from the self sown grass/weeds at the back of the area, that both [the inspector] and [your son] thought might be the source of the footway water issue you referred to. We will liaise with our colleagues in Streetscene to see if they can apply weed killer to this area of self sown grass/weeds.</p>
