


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One thousand nine

hundred and thirty-six BETWEEN JAMES HENRY HINGE of Church End Farm Hendon in the County of Middlesex Farmer and Dairyman and FANNY JULIA HINGE of Church End Farm Hendon aforesaid (hereinafter called "the Vendors") of the one part and THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX (hereinafter called "the Council") of the other part WHEREAS by a Conveyance dated the Fourteenth day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven and made between Walter Lyulph Johnson of the one part and the said James Henry Hinge and William Hinge of the other part certain property including (inter alia) the property hereinafter described and hereby conveyed was conveyed unto the said James Henry Hinge and William Hinge in fee simple as joint tenants subject to the right (so far as the same might then be in existence and had not lapsed) in the said Conveyance now in recital and hereinafter more particularly set forth and described upon trust for sale as therein mentioned AND WHEREAS the said William Hinge died on the Ninth day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four AND WHEREAS by a Deed of Appointment dated the Twenty-second day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four and made between the said James Henry Hinge of the one part and Fanny Julia Hinge of the other part the said James Henry Hinge in exercise of the power for that purpose conferred upon him by the Trustee Act 1925 and of every other power in that behalf him enabling thereby appointed the said Fanny Julia Hinge to be a new Trustee of the statutory trusts affecting the property described in the Schedule to the Deed now in recital which included the property hereinafter described and intended to be hereby conveyed in place of the said William Hinge AND WHEREAS the property hereim fter described and hereby conveyed being required by the Council for the purposes of the Education Act 1921 the Council on the Thirty-first day of May One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four made an Order under the Public Works Facilities Act 1930 for the compulsory acquisition of such property and the said Order was on the Third day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four confirmed by the Board of Education AND WHEREAS the assessment of the purchase money to be paid by the Council in respect of the acquisition



of the said property was referred to Hugh C Webster an Official Arbitrator who by his Award dated the Twenty-sixth day of November One thousand Nine hundred and thirty-five directed the ... Council to pay the sum of NINE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND FORTY POUNDS in respect of the freehold interest in the said property hereinafter described and hereby conveyed and the subject matter of such Award with vacant possession -----

NOW THIS CONVEYANCE WITNESSES as follows: --

IN pursuance of the said Award and in consideration of the said sum of Nine thousand four hundred and forty pounds now paid by the Council to the Vendors (the receipt whereof the Vendors hereby acknow ledge) the Vendors as Beneficial Owners hereby convey unto the Council ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate on the West side of The Burroughs in the Parish and Borough of Hendon in the County of Middlesex and having a frontage to such road of One hundred and nime ty feet and containing an area of Two dedmal Seven Six Seven acres or thereabouts all which said piece or parcel of land is more particularly delineated on the plan annexed hereto and is thereon rights in the coloured pink TOGETHER with such/mines and minerals within and under the said property as the Vendors may have $\underline{\text{TO HOLD}}$ the same unto the Council in fee simple but subject to the right (so far as the same is still in existence and has not lapsed) of Dr. de Caux of Hendon Grove (the successor of the late Henry Hicks) his heirs and assigns and his and their agents servants and workmen to lay and put down all necessary pipes to the pond the site of which forms part of the land hereby conveyed and more particularly described in the said Conveyance of the Fourteenth day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven and numbered 856a. on the plan drawn thereon for the purpose of supplying with water from the said pond certain hereditaments described in the said Conveyance of the Fourteenth day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven as the Mansion House stabling gardens and other hereditaments of Edward Firman Ellis his heirs and assigns and also to repair amend and cleanse the same pipes from time to time as occasion should require and for that purpose to enter upon the land hereby conveyed as in the said Conveyance mentioned the said Dr. de Caux his heirs and assigns

making good all damage occasioned thereby which right was granted by an Indenture of Release dated the Eighth day of April One thousand eight hundred and eighteen made between William Fountain Johnson of the first part Edward Firmin Ellis of the second part and Welbore Ellis of the third part but otherwise free from incumbrances -----IT IS HEREBY AGREED AND DECLARED that the said purchase money of Nine thousand four hundred and forty pounds shall be deemed to include compensation for and shall be accepted in full satisfaction of all items of claim whether specifically mentioned or otherwise arising out of the taking by the Council of the said property hereby conveyed and the user thereof for the purposes of the Education Act 1921 or any other statute for the purposes of which the said property may be appropriated including the execution of any works authorised by the said Education Act 1921 or any other statute as aforesaid ----THE Vendors hereby acknowledge the right of the Council to production of the documents set forth in the Schedule hereto and to delivery of copies thereof and hereby undertake with the Council for the safe custody of the same documents -----

IN WITNESS whereof the Vendors have hereunto set their respective hands and seals and the Council has caused its Common Seal to be hereunto affixed the day and year first before written -----
