Response

I am writing to inform you that we have searched our records and although we hold some of the information requested, some of the information you requested is not held by London Borough of Barnet.

We have provided answers to your request below.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I request the disclosure of the following information relating to telephone kiosks and advertising infrastructure located outside the Costa Coffee premises on the High Road, North Finchley, London N12, specifically on the pavement immediately outside Costa Coffee (Unit 813 High Road, London, N12 8PR) at the junction of Lodge Lane and the High Road, North Finchley (N12).

1. Planning / Consent for Telephone Kiosks

Please provide:

a) Records showing when planning permission, highway consent, or any other form of council approval was granted for the installation, retention, replacement or relocation of any telephone kiosk(s) at the above location.

It is likely that the installation of many telephone kiosks predates the Barnet Planning Register which was established in 1965.

All public records are permanently retained on the public planning register

Part 16 Class A of Schedule 2 to the General Permitted Development Order provides permitted development rights for electronic communications code operators. This includes the right to undertake certain works without the requirement for a full planning application to be made. The development must be carried out in accordance with the details approved, and it must begin not later than five years from the date of the notice.

Search terms to use "Payphones", "BT Kiosk", "Communication hub", "InLink structure", "BT Street Hub"

Proposed Lawful Development Certificates (LDCs) for installation of new public payphones going back as early as 1993 but none at the location of interest.

Applications are on the Public Planning Register for a "Replacement" or "new" BT kiosk but none at the location of interest.

There is an open Planning Enforcement case ref: ENF/0551/21 at 813 High Road, London N12 8PR which in part looked at the matter the phonebox at the location referred to. The element relating to the matter of the payphone was found not expedient to take any action. The response to Cllr Schneiderman, dated 24 April 2024, asking about a campaign to have the phone boxes outside the address be removed because they were derelict and were being used as a rubbish store.

An extract from the response to the Cllr from the Planning Enforcement Officer reads as follows:

The use of the telephone kiosk

As BT own the kiosk it will be up to that organisation to remove the kiosk. You, in respect to your email, have obviously made diligent investigation in to this matter, but Barnet Council departments, such as Highways or Planning, have no powers to have this kiosk removed. These kiosks were granted permission by the Council at the time of their installation. The Council cannot demand that the kiosk (in question), is removed any more than it can demand that the public use the kiosk for its intended purpose.

I can only wish you every success with your endeavours, regarding the kiosk as again, my personal view is that the kiosk is redundant in this age of mobile phones and other portable devices that service communication.

No kiosks are found under [Locally listed buildings | Barnet Council](#) (a local designation).

Eight K6 telephone kiosks in Barnet worthy of historic retention have been successfully listed, see [Statutory listed buildings | Barnet Council](#) but none at the location of interest.

No highway licences or wayleaves are required as BT are a Statutory Undertaker

It is likely that the installation of many telephone kiosks predates the Barnet Planning Register which was established in 1965.

In 1935 the K6 was designed to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of George V. It was consequently sometimes known as the "Jubilee" kiosk and were installed between 1936 and 1966.

There is no record of a K6 Telephone Box existing at the location of interest.

In terms of the process for removal of telephone kiosks is as follows:

London Borough of Barnet received a notification from British Telecommunications plc (BT) of intent to remove a public payphone. This is under the required process of the Communications Act 2003 within which the local authority must be notified and given the opportunity to agree or object to the removal of any of the payphones proposed for removal. In the period since receipt of the notification, extensive consultation has taken place with local councillors and the public.

Ofcom is the governing body on the removals procedure for public payphones and sets out both the requirements of BT and the local authority. The decision making process is set out below:

- (a) BT displays a notice in the phone box stating its intent to remove payphone facility;
- (b) BT writes to the local authority notifying them of the payphone proposed for removal;
- (c) the local authority consults with interested parties;
- (d) 42 days should be the minimum period between receipt of the notification and the draft decision;
- (e) a draft decision is made considering representations made;
- (f) the draft decision is made public for at least 1 month;
- (g) the local authority considers any representations made on the draft decision; and
- (h) a final decision is made and forwarded to BT.

The Council previously held a street furniture agreement with JCDecaux that included, among other things, 6 sheet advertising rights and provision of bus shelters (including some that do not carry advertising). The agreement was made in 1994 - originally for a period of around 20 years. Not all bus shelters in the borough are provided through this agreement. Many are provided by Transport for London.

We have decided to withhold details of the contract held, see Refusal Notice below.

There was a contract. It has now expired. We are considering our options for a potential new arrangement.

R12(5)(e) Confidential commercial information

R12(5)(e) Confidential commercial information. We are also withholding under the exception in regulation 12(5)(e) as it was received in confidence and we have been informed us that it is commercially sensitive and not within the public domain. The potential for economic harm to the contractor and risk of related legal action against the Council outweighs the public interest in release of this information. Accordingly the information requested falls within

Regulation 12(5)(e) as it is commercial information. The question arises as to whether in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information. I have considered whether the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information. There are a number of public interest arguments that weigh in favour of disclosing the information you have sought:

- The general proposition of maximising openness that the EIR and the Council aspire to;
- The benefits of ensuring transparent and accountable government by disclosing how the Council receives and spends public money

However, there are also public interest arguments against disclosure:

- Releasing the requested information could prejudice the Council's future negotiation capabilities and reduce the confidence third parties have with the Council in order to facilitate the decision making process. Both the Council and any third party contractor would be reluctant to have free and frank discussions if all that is discussed is subject to scrutiny with no safe space for 'confidential communications', the requested information may prejudice pending or future decisions which would be detrimental to the Council and or third parties.

The public interest in withholding the requested information outweighs the public interest in disclosure of the requested information. Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.
