Thank you for your request received on 22 January 2026, for the following information:

The 7 July 2025 Proposed introduction to Underhill South (US) Controlled Parking Zone letter ref: SCR652 stated that:

"Some residents and businesses have therefore made requests for the Council to introduce parking controls to help resolve their parking concerns."

Barnet Council have now confirmed that no permits have been issued to non-residents in the zone to date.

Please name all of the businesses that made requests to introduce parking controls.

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested. However, we believe that the exceptions detailed below apply to all of this information and this is withheld. Please see the Refusal Notice below.

R12(4)(d) - Material which is still in the course of completion, unfinished documents or incomplete data

We consider that regulation 12(4)(d) - Material which is still in the course of completion, unfinished documents or incomplete data applies to the information requested because we consider that the request involves information that is in draft form.

Therefore, we have decided to withhold some of the information.

In applying this exception, we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the interest in favour of disclosure.

Public interest test considerations

I have considered whether the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information. There are a number of public interest arguments that weigh in favour of disclosing the information you have sought:

- The general proposition of maximising openness that the EIR and the Council aspire to;
- The benefits of ensuring transparent and accountable government by disclosing how the Council receives and spends public money;

However, there are also public interest arguments against disclosure:

- This is an experimental CPZ that is a six-months statutory consultation from 15th December 2025 to 14th June 2026.
- Transparency and public scrutiny of decision making objectives will be met by making the details of the officer report available once finalised.

In all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
