Thank you for your request received on 18 June 2019, for the following information:

Can you tell us how many young carers\* (aged 17 years and under) you have listed in your local authority area for the following years April to March: 2014/15; 2015/16; 2016/17; 2017/18; 2018/19.

- \* Can you tell us the source of your information on numbers of young carers\* in your local authority area.
- \* Can you tell us how many of those young carers\* (ages 17 years and under) identified in question 1 ' have had assessments, for the following years April to March: 2014/15; 2015/16; 2016/17; 2017/18; 2018/19.
- \* Can you tell us how many young carers assessments you have carried out in your local authority area for the following years April to March: 2014/15; 2015/16; 2016/17; 2017/18; 2018/19.
- \*definition of a young carer: A young carer is someone under 18 who helps look after someone in their family, or a friend, who is ill, disabled or misuses drugs or alcohol.

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

## Response

The council holds the information requested the answers to your questions are below

Can you tell us how many young carers\* (aged 17 years and under) you have listed in your local authority area for the following years April to March: 2014/15; 2015/16; 2016/17; 2017/18; 2018/19.

The contract for your young carers service was recommissioned in 2016, and we do not hold this information prior to the current contract. The current contract focuses on identifying young carers as well as support, which means that we now have more robust figures available on the number of young carers

2016/17 There were 680 young carers identified by 31.3.2017.

This is based on data held by the Barnet Young Carers Advisory Centre

2017/18 There were 725 young carers identified by 31.3.2018.

This is based on data held by the Barnet Young Carers Advisory Centre

2018/19 There were 843 young carers identified in Q3 during 2018-19).

This is based on data held by the Barnet Young Carers Advisory Centre

By March 2019, this total reduced to 772 due to young people leaving the service or turning 18 and being supported through Barnet's service to support adult carers.

\* Can you tell us the source of your information on numbers of young carers\* in your local authority area.

Barnet Family Services holds a contract with Carers Trust (Barnet Carers Centre) for carer assessment and support to carers. The service for young carers delivered under this contract is known as the Barnet Young Carers Advisory Centre.

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Here are the number of young carer (ages 17 years and under) assessments completed:

2016/17 - 34

2017/18 - 68

2018/19 - 148

These figures include the carers identified above.

\* Can you tell us how many young carers assessments you have carried out in your local authority area for the following years April to March: 2014/15; 2015/16; 2016/17; 2017/18; 2018/19.
