Your website for Network Recovery Plan has not been updated since 2018 and therefore this information is not being shared. 2. I understand the Council using a rating/assessment system to accordingly allocate budget to resurfacing and road works in order of priority - this has been detailed to me in the past. I would like to request the scale/ratings and assessment information for: Goldsmith Avenue NW9 and Esmar Crescent NW9.

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

The council holds the information requested and the answers to your questions are below

The website is updated month on month with works that are going on. This is because whilst the programme should be pretty concrete at this point, it is (as always) subject to change. All planned works are in the Environment Committee report from March. Omitted since then is Central Square (footway) as it is private land. Rowley Lane was added to the carriageway resurfacing programme

2. I understand the Council using a rating/assessment system to accordingly allocate budget to resurfacing and road works in order of priority - this has been detailed to me in the past.
