Thank you for your request received on 23 September 2019, for the following information:

Can you please let me have a copy of the food safety officer's report.

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested. However, we consider that the following exceptions apply to some of the information requested.

We consider that regulation 12 (4) (d) (In course of completion, unfinished or incomplete) applies to the information requested because we consider that the request relates to material which is still in the course of completion, to unfinished documents or to incomplete data.

Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

Refusal Notice - Regulation 12 (4) (d)

We consider that regulation 12 (4) (d) (In course of completion, unfinished or incomplete) applies to the information requested because we consider that the request relates to material which is still in the course of completion, to unfinished documents or to incomplete data.

Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information. In applying this exemption, we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the interest in favour of disclosure.

R14(4) (d) the request relates to material which is still in the course of completion, to unfinished documents or to incomplete data

Regulation 12(4)(d) Material still in the course of completion has been applied. As such the Council argues that the internal communications should be withheld to maintain "a safe, internal, confidential, private space (away from the public and hence external scrutiny) in which it is able to discuss and determine such issues affecting it, in order to facilitate full and frank deliberation and debate and permit high

quality decision making which is required for the sound performance of the Council as a whole”.

Public interest test considerations

I have considered whether the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information. There are a number of public interest arguments that weigh in favour of disclosing the information you have sought:

- The general proposition of maximising openness that the EIR and the Council aspire to;
- The benefits of ensuring transparent and accountable government by disclosing how the Council receives and spends public money;

However, there are also public interest arguments against disclosure:

- We have checked our records and can see that the last food hygiene inspection was carried out on 17 September 2019. The rating for the inspection is not yet showing on the Food Standards Agency website as there is an appeal period after our inspection.

The rating will show 28 days after our inspection.

- Transparency and public scrutiny of decision making objectives will be met by making the details held on the database available on request

The public interest in withholding the requested information outweighs the public interest in disclosure of the requested information.
