Thank you for your request received on 5 November 2019, for the following information:

Information requested:

Please note this request relates to all residential buildings within the local authority area. The fact that the local authority does not own housing stock is therefore not a relevant reason to refuse to respond or to provide a nil response. I am also not asking for individual buildings to be identified, therefore an exemption on public safety grounds would not stand. This line of argument has been tested on appeal in previous requests.

On July 18, the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government wrote to all local authorities in England requiring them to begin gathering data about tower blocks in their area (residential buildings above 18m) and the materials used in the external wall. - 2. The number of the buildings from (1) where the materials used in the external wall cannot be, or has not yet been, identified
- 3. The number of the buildings from (1) where aluminium composite material (ACM) has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)
- 4. The number of the buildings from (1) where high pressure laminate material has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)
- 5. The number of the buildings from (1) where timber cladding has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)
- 6. The number of the buildings from (1) where combustible insulation, including but not limited to polystyrene, polyisocyanurate and phenolic foam has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnetholds the information you requested.

However, we consider that the following exceptionsapply to some of the information requested. The remaining information is not withheld and is below/attached.

Q1The number of high rise buildings so far identified in your local authority area (please indicate whether this is a final number, or if the data is still being gathered)

There are 31 high rise buildings in our management (final number)

Q2. The number of the buildings from (1) where the materials used in the external wall cannot be, or has not yet been, identified:

All external wall materials identified

Q3. The number of the buildings from (1) where aluminium composite material (ACM) has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)

There were 3 blocks that were previously clad with ACM. These were stripped in 2017 and re-clad in 2018 with compliant materials

Q4. The number of the buildings from (1) where high pressure laminate material has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)

There are three buildings with HPL cladding. All have been tested and declared acceptable with classification B s1 d0. All three blocks are due for demolition as part of a regeneration project in 2022.

Q5. The number of the buildings from (1) where timber cladding has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)

No high rise blocks in our management have timber façade or cladding

Q6. The number of the buildings from (1) where combustible insulation, including but not limited to polystyrene, polyisocyanurate and phenolic foam has been identified on the building (whether as part of a cladding system or otherwise)

There are two buildings that have phenolic foam mechanically face fixed direct to the concrete structure and finished with non-combustible cement render. The Windows do not bridge the insulation .
