Please provide copies of all information held concerning communication to and from the council, reports etc held regarding street parking, off street parking, pavement and cross over issues affecting or allegedly affecting 46 and/or 48 Rowsley Avenue Hendon NW4 1AJ from 1 June 2019 to date.

Please provide all information held regarding the decision by the Council to install and the installation of a post outside 46 Rowsley Avenue during the same period, including advance notification to householders at 46 and/ or 48 Rowsley Avenue.

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Response

The council holds the information requested and the answers to your questions are below

Please provide copies of all information held concerning communication to and from the council, reports etc held regarding street parking, off street parking, pavement and cross over issues affecting or allegedly affecting 46 and/or 48 Rowsley Avenue Hendon NW4 1AJ from 1 June 2019 to date.

Please provide all information held regarding the decision by the Council to install and the installation of a post outside 46 Rowsley Avenue during the same period, including advance notification to householders at 46 and/ or 48 Rowsley Avenue.

The instruction to install the bollard was given by the relevant area highway inspector to stop the residents vehicles illegally cutting across the footpath to park on the frontage which is much wider than the existing crossover. The inspector also confirms that they have not prevented the residents access to their property but the installation prevents them from driving diagonally across the un-strengthened footway.

The Highways Team do not have to consult to install a bollard on the public footway to protect the public asset from damage

No consultation or notification to residents was required.
