Thank you for your request received on 14 January 2020, for the following information:

1) The total number of jobs that have been lost in Barnet as a result of the One Barnet programme.

2) The total number of Barnet Council employees TUPE'd to other organisations as a result of the One Barnet Outsourcing,

3) The total number of Barnet Council employees made redundant as a result of the One Barnet Outsourcing program

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Response

I am writing to inform you that we have searched our records and the information you requested is not held by London Borough of Barnet.

This relates to information over 7 years old and data is not required to be kept for more that 6 years. Also as HR was one of the services which was out-sourced with no access to this data as London Borough of Barnet were locked out from the corporate data on One Barnet for commercial/confidentiality reasons, the data has not been stored corporately.
