Schools record incidents of physical restraint internally, according to their individual policy. Generally, where physical restraint is included as part of a young person's behaviour management plan, incidents would be logged but not recorded in detail. A more detailed record would be expected where an incident has occurred and physical intervention has been necessary, which is not included in any plan. This record would include recording any injuries to staff or pupils. Records are retained by the schools.
