Thank you for your request received on 24 February 2020, for the following information:

- 1) In the last financial year (2018/19) how much money was paid as compensation for property damage and personal injury caused by potholes?
- 2) How many individual claims did this represent?
- 3) Please tell me the value of the biggest claim settled in 2018/19, and the location of the pothole that caused the incident. Please provide a brief description of the incident (e.g. cyclist fell off bike going over pothole and broke their leg)

Note: All questions relate to compensation paid in 2018/19 irrespective of when the injury/damage took place or when the claim was lodged. No details of costs and payments to solicitors are requested.

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnetholds the information you requested.

However, we consider that the following exemptions apply to some of the information requested. The remaining information is not withheld and is below.

The council holds the information requested and the answers to your questions are below

1) In the last financial year (2018/19) how much money was paid as compensation for property damage and personal injury caused by potholes?

£75009.75

2) How many individual claims did this represent?

84 individual claims

3) Please tell me the value of the biggest claim settled in 2018/19, and the location of the pothole that caused the incident. Please provide a brief

description of the incident (e.g. cyclist fell off bike going over pothole and broke their leg)

Largest individual settlement was £5,000 for damages. Located in NW9 0. Description- Claimant suffered broken ankle, bruised knee and hip. Some details of the location and nature of description have been withheld as this could indentify an individual.

We consider that the absolute exemption set out in Section 40 (Personal information) subsection 2 applies to some of the information requested. Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

Refusal Notice Section 40(2)

Part 1 of Schedule 19 of the Data Protection Act 2018 amends the personal data exemption under section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000(FOI). These are consequential amendments designed to ensure that the correct provisions of the GDPR and the new Act are referenced instead of the now repealed DPA 1998. They will not fundamentally impact when personal data can, and cannot, be disclosed in response to an FOI request.

Personal Information is governed by the Data Protection Act legislation and is defined as any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject')". It adds that: an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location number, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person.

The withheld information is exempt because disclosure would contravene the first data protection principle which requires that personal data is processed fairly and lawfully. Disclosure of the requested information would breach this principle and in particular the requirement of fairness.
