Thank you for your request received on 16 April 2020, for the following information:

I would like to make an open government request for all the information which I am entitled to under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Please provide me with details of planning applications which relate to developments of 100+ units and where:

- Planning consent expires within the next 6-12 months;
- The consent has not been extended;
- Work on site has not commenced.

Please provide this information on an excel spreadsheet.

If this request is unclear or too broad, I would be grateful if you could get into contact with me, as under the Act, the local authority is required to advise and assist requesters.

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested. However, we consider that the following exceptionsapply to some of the information requested.

We consider that Regulation 6(1)(b) applies to the information requested because the information requested is already publicly available and easily accessible.

Details of all current and historic planning applications received by London Borough of Barnet that we hold electronic records for since 1965. https://open.barnet.gov.uk/dataset/2nq32/planning-applications

Planning applications are available online on the Barnet website, to look at applications where the permission is expiring you would need to put the date of decision as 5 years ago in the box, applications of over 100 unit's will be a major application, so that can be put in the application type box in the advance search.

If an application has been made to extend the consent it will show as additional applications on the site.
