We only have access to finalised data regarding road traffic personal injury collisions provided by TfL up to the end of December 2018, and provisional date for January to June 2019. A wide range of finalised data to the end of 2018 can be accessed on-line via TfL's website https://tfl.gov.uk/corporate/publications-and-reports/road-safety

The provisional data for Barnet from January to June 2019 records no collisions involving a cyclist fatality in that period.

The road names or postcodes of cycling accidents during the same period

The provisional data for Barnet from January to June 2019 records collisions in which a cyclist was involved that resulted in serious or slight injury to a cyclist, or to another person are recorded in the roads listed below.

Applications for funding for measures from the Department for Transport and via Transport for London for cycling measures to support cycling have been made, or are being developed currently. Total spend will depend on the result of applications made, and the arrangements for tranches of the funding that are yet to be released. Our plans for cycling facilities currently envisage lightly segregated facilities rather than proposals that offer vehicle restraint.
