Thank you for your request received on 12 June 2020, for the following information:

I am interested in gathering the statistics of all Barnet secondary schools for Year 9.

My question is:
How many is in the waiting list for Year 9?
What are their distances?
Are there any looked after children in the waiting list?
How many in the waiting list has siblings in the school?
What is the closest distance?

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

### Please note:

- This data is subject to change on a daily basis dependent on movement of students.
- Minus figures indicate school who have gone over number for that year group.
- As requested nearest and furthest distances have been provided, however
  this is not an indication of position on waiting list. Each school will have their
  own admissions criteria and certain criteria's may place a child higher on the
  waiting list. For example: a sibling may live further but will rank higher on the
  waiting list than a child whose admissions criteria is based on geography.
- LAC children are not subject to waiting list positions. There placements are arranged between the virtual school, Barnet school admissions and the identified school. – Therefore there are no LAC children on any year 9 waiting list.

- Sibling data has not been provided as there are no more that 3 siblings on any waiting list and these children could therefore be identified if data was provided.

Please note that we have omitted the data where the values are 5 or less as this could reveal the identities of the children. We consider that this information is exempt under section 40 of FOIA. Please see the refusal notice below.

### Refusal Notice

Section 40 FOIA sets out an exemption from the right to know if the information requested is personal information protected by the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA).

The DPA which governs the processing of personal data and defines personal data "as any data which relate to a living individual who can be identified from those data, or from those data and other information which is in the possession of, or is likely to come into the possession of, the data controller."

Section 40 (2) FOIA exempts disclosure of information if such disclosure would contravene one of the data protection principles. This exemption is absolute and is not subject to the public interest test.

The first of the data protection principles requires that personal data is processed fairly and lawfully. It is our view that to disclose the withheld information would breach this principle, in particular, the requirement of fairness because the children have a reasonable expectation of privacy and do not expect that their personal information would be released in a response to a freedom of information request.

# Advice and Assistance : Direct Marketing
