Since the beginning of our Electric Charge point programme, Barnet Council has installed a total of 98 charge points across the borough. None of these have been removed. The charge points installed consist of:

- * 22 7kWh charge points located across two leisure centre based community hubs at Copthall Leisure Centre (14) and New Barnet Leisure Centre (8)
- * 72 3.5kWh lamp column charge points across the borough at the locations listed below:

The residential lamp column charge points each have one connector. The 7kWh freestanding and community hub charge points each have two connectors Usage for the charge points across the borough is charged at £0.34/kWh; however, we will continue to review the cost for our resident in order to continue to provide value for money. The council applied for both rounds of funding available through the Go Ultra Low City Scheme (GULCS). We were successful in securing a total of £744,000 across the two rounds.

Under the terms of the GULCS funding the council is required to provide match funding of 25% for the installation of residential and freestanding charge points.
