We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

The council holds the information requested and the answers to your questions are below

The number of active Low Traffic Neighbourhoods in the borough and their location * The date of each LTN installation and the cost

* The number of Penalty Charge Notices issued for breaches of each of the LTN regulations

* The amount of revenue generated from PCNs issued for breaches of each of the LTN regulations from the point the LTN was installed up to the most recently available data.

We assume the request refers to schemes introduced since April 2020 using funding provided through the government's walking and cycling programme (either direct or via TfL), or to other similar proposals introduced in that time.

In Barnet no projects have been introduced from April 2020 that we would identify as 'Low Traffic Neighbourhoods', but some 'School Street' proposals have been introduced that you may consider similar. However no penalty charge notices associated with 'Moving Traffic Contraventions' had been sent out in relation to these at 30 September 2020, and therefore no money received.
