Why the Council require double yellow lines on Stanhope Gardens NW7

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

## Response

The council holds the information requested and the answers to your questions are below.

Why the Council require double yellow lines on Stanhope Gardens NW7.

The Council received several concerns about access difficulties by emergency and refuse vehicles on locations of various roads due obstructive parking. In response to this, a decision has been made to consult residents and businesses on the possible introduction of parking controls in the roads across the borough that have been prioritised for investigations.

Therefore, we proposed to introduce lengths of double yellow lines ('at any time' waiting restrictions) where these problems have been highlighted, inclusive of replacing parking bays with waiting restrictions at some of the locations.

The measures help to maintain access for fire engines, ambulances and refuse vehicles and improve road safety.
