Thank you for your request received on 24 January 2021, for the following information:

As part of the new cycle lanes scheme, double yellow lines have appeared opposite East Finchley Station.

On Saturday 23rd at 9am two vehicles were parked outside the Newsagent on the double yellow lines.

A traffic warden ticketed one of the vehicles, a private car.

He did not ticket the other vehicle, a trade vehicle doing work for Barnet Council.

My Freedom of Information Request is

Is it legal for a trade vehicle doing work for Barnet Council to be exempt from the restrictions.

If so, please direct me to the legislation that permits this.

Photos of the 2 vehicles are attached.

Please also inform me if the private car ticket has been cancelled or not.

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

### Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.

However, we consider that the following exemptions apply to some of the information requested. The remaining information is not withheld and is below.

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He did not ticket the other vehicle, a trade vehicle doing work for Barnet Council.

My Freedom of Information Request is

Q1 - Is it legal for a trade vehicle doing work for Barnet Council to be exempt from the restrictions.

Q2 - If so, please direct me to the legislation that permits this.

Photos of the 2 vehicles are attached.

Please also inform me if the private car ticket has been cancelled or not.

Q1 - A vehicle is permitted to park on a double yellow line if for example loading/unloading is taking place and is observed by a Civil Enforcement Officer. No information is recorded about the reason for the vehicle being parked at the location and therefore a specific exemption (if any applied) can not be stated.

Any exemption applied would be under the following legislation:

Q2 - We consider that the absolute exemption set out in Section 40 (Personal information) subsection 2 applies to the information requested with regards to the vehicle in question not being registered to the requester of information. Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

### **Refusal Notice Section 40(2)**

Part 1 of Schedule 19 of the Data Protection Act 2018 amends the personal data exemption under section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000(FOI). These are consequential amendments designed to ensure that the correct provisions of the GDPR and the new Act are referenced instead of the now repealed DPA 1998. They will not fundamentally impact when personal data can, and cannot, be disclosed in response to an FOI request.

Personal Information is governed by the Data Protection Act legislation and is defined as any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject')". It adds that: an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location number, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person.

The withheld information is exempt because disclosure would contravene the first data protection principle which requires that personal data is processed fairly and lawfully. Disclosure of the requested information would breach this principle and in particular the requirement of fairness.
