Thank you for your request received on 4 August 2021, for the following information:

- 1...As far as housing support (including but not limited to housing benefit) is concerned what is the highest amount currently being paid by the council to or on behalf of a claimant (s). Can you state how much is being paid to or on behalf of the claimant (s) on a weekly or monthly basis. Is this payment being made directly to the claimant? If not, who is receiving the payment? For instance, is the payment being made to a landlord or other kind of accommodation provider. Can you specify? In the case of the payment can you specify what type of payment it is. For instance, is it housing benefit?
- 2...How many claimants are currently claiming at this level. In the case of each of these claimants claiming at this level are any required to repay any part of the payment to the council, can you, please state the level of repayment on a weekly or monthly basis.
- 3...In the case of each claimant claiming at this level how long have they been claiming at this level. It is possible that these claimants have a long-standing claim (s) with the council which has included payments at this as well as at other levels. In the case of each of these claimants what is the total amount they have claimed from the council so far and over what period of time.
- 4...In the case of those claimant (s) currently in receipt of the highest weekly or monthly amounts (as described in questions one or two) can you state how many dependants are living with them in the property (ie) covered by the claim. These dependants will include spouses, partners, children and members of an extended family. Can you provide the ages of each dependent?
- 5...In the case of each claimant claiming at this level can you provide some details of their accommodation. Can you state whether they are living in a hotel or in bed and breakfast accommodation or in a hostel or similar. Alternatively, are the claimants living in a flat, apartment, maisonette or similar? Can you please state which? Alternatively, are the claimants living in a house? If the claimant is living in a house, can you provide the following details. How many storeys does the property have? Is the property detached, semi-detached, a bungalow, terraced or other? Can you please state which? How many gardens does the property have? Are the garden (s) at the front or

back of the property? How many bedrooms does the property have? How many bathrooms does the property have? How many toilets does the property have? Does the property have a garage? Does the property have a conservatory?

- 6...Irrespective of the type of accommodation used by the claimant (s) is the accommodation within the council's own geographical area? If it is NOT within the council's own geographical area, can you state which town, city, borough, village the property is in. If the accommodation is in the council's geographical area, can you, please provide details of the electoral ward. Can you also provide details of the post code?
- 7...For whatever reason has the council (and not just its benefit or housing department) asked the claimant for details of the claimant's place of birth. If the answer is yes can state, the claimant's country of birth.

We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.

However, we consider that the following exemptions apply to some of the information requested - see refusal notice below.

The remaining information is not withheld and is below.

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Housing benefit - £800.89 per week - paid to claimant.

2...How many claimants are currently claiming at this level. In the case of each of these claimants claiming at this level are any required to repay any part of the payment to the council, can you, please state the level of repayment on a weekly or monthly basis.

One. No repayment.

At this level since 17.05.21. Records held confirm claiming at address since 28.03.2004. Total claimed £516,911.68

4...In the case of those claimant (s) currently in receipt of the highest weekly or monthly amounts (as described in questions one or two) can you state how many dependants are living with them in the property (i.e) covered by the claim. These dependants will include spouses, partners, children and members of an extended family. Can you provide the ages of each dependent?

This information is exempt as we are applying the exemption under Section 40 (2) to this information. Please see the Refusal Notice below.

Refusal Notice Section 40(2)

We consider that the absolute exemption set out in Section 40 (Personal information) subsection (2) applies to the information requested. Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

Part 1 of Schedule 19 of the Data Protection Act 2018 amends the personal data exemption under section 40 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000(FOI). These are consequential amendments designed to ensure that the correct provisions of the GDPR and the new Act are referenced instead of the now repealed DPA 1998. They will not fundamentally impact when personal data can, and cannot, be disclosed in response to an FOI request.

Personal Information is governed by the Data Protection Act legislation and is defined as any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject')'. It adds that: an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location number, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person.

The withheld information is exempt because disclosure would contravene the first data protection principle which requires that personal data is processed fairly and lawfully. Disclosure of the requested information would breach this principle and in particular the requirement of fairness. We believe the information requested in questions 4,5 & 6 could potentially lead to the data subjects being identified if released.
