Thank you for your request received on 5 August 2021, for the following information:

1. The total number of Looked After Children under your local authority care, where family members outside the United Kingdom were explored\* for each calendar year between January 2018 and December 2020 inclusive.

2. The number of Looked After Children under your local authority care that were placed outside the United Kingdom for each calendar year between January 2018 and December 2020 inclusive.

3. The number and type of placement orders used for placing Looked After Children from your local authority care with family members outside the United Kingdom for each calendar year between January 2018 and December 2020 inclusive.

For the purposes of this request Looked After Children is defined as being subject to

- \* Section 31 The Children Act 1989;
- \* Section 38 Children act 1989;
- \* Section 20 Children Act 1989.

\*Please note that by 'where family members outside the United Kingdom were explored', we mean where a family member of a Looked After Child under your local authority care outside the United Kingdom was identified, considered as a possible carer for the child, and steps to assess the family member as a suitable carer for the child were considered. Please include both:

\* children where an assessment of a family member outside the UK was considered but not actually carried out; and

\* children where an assessment of a family member outside the UK was carried out.

Please provide the information electronically. For ease and clarity, please see the format provided below:

# Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested. However, we are withholding some of that information since we consider that the following exemptionsapply to it.

# 1. The total number of Looked After Children under your local authority care, where family members outside the United Kingdom were explored\* for each calendar year between January 2018 and December 2020 inclusive.

We are unable to provide this information within the statutory 18-hour limit because we do not hold this data in a reportable format. To obtain this information we need to read each Looked after Child's file to ascertain if family members outside the United Kingdom were explored as possible carers.

Over the 3years almost 800 children have come into care. It would take at least 5 minutes to review each case to find out if family members outside the United Kingdom were explored as possible carers.

800 cases x 5 minutes = 4000 minutes (67 Hours).

We must therefore refuse your request, please see Refusal notice (Section 12) below.

## **Refusal Notice**

Section 12 of FOIA states that the council does not have to comply with a request for information if the cost of compliance exceeds the appropriate limit of £450 calculated at £25 per hour with a limit of 18 hours. The appropriate limit relates strictly to the process of determining whether the information is held; locating, retrieving and extracting the information, or a document containing it.

#### 2. The number of Looked After Children under your local authority care that were placed outside the United Kingdom for each calendar year between January 2018 and December 2020 inclusive.

We are unable to provide the data as the numbers are less than 5. Please see the Refusal Notice (Personal data -exemption) below.

**Refusal Notice** Personal data Section 40(2) identifying individuals through statistical tables (fewer than 5) The information you require is below, but some information has been redacted in the table. This is because in some instances, owing to the low numbers of individuals involved (fewer than 5) disclosing this data may make it possible for individuals to be identified. This information is therefore exempt by virtue of section 40 (2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), as disclosure of this information to the public generally, in the Council's view, would not be consistent with data protection principles in Article 5 of the General Data Protection Regulations. This is an absolute exemption and the public interest test does not apply

#### 3. The number and type of placement orders used for placing Looked After Children from your local authority care with family members outside the United Kingdom for each calendar year between January 2018 and December 2020 inclusive.
