Response

I am writing to inform you that we have searched our records and although we hold some of the information requested, some is not held by London Borough of Barnet because several questions relate to work which is underway and not published. Link to Draft Local Plan Reg 19 provided below.



We have provided answers to your request below showing where we do not hold the information requested.

Have you declared a climate emergency?

The Council recently passed a resolution noting that the same environmental challenges that are faced by the UK are also faced in Barnet, and that Barnet's commitment to remain a green and pleasant borough goes hand-in-hand with the Council's commitment to fighting climate change and pollution. The Council believes that taking action on climate change is more important than statements. Barnet has significantly invested in tree planting and parks and open spaces, adopted a Long Term Transport Strategy focused on developing active travel options, and introduced over 100 electric vehicle charge points, to improve air quality. The redevelopment of Brent Cross will see the creation of a carbon neutral park town by 2030 at the latest

2. a. Do you have an action plan or strategy (or equivalent) related to net zero goals? Y

We are currently reviewing the actions of the Council, and will soon be bringing forward a draft of the boroughs' first Sustainability Strategy. This will set out what we are already doing, and propose new actions and objectives which will enable us to meet the ambitious targets of the government, as well as detailing how we can empower residents, businesses, and partners to similarly make meaningful changes.

b. If yes, is 'Spatial Planning' featured within the action plan/strategy?

We will be bringing forward a full list of actions with the draft Sustainability Strategy once it goes to Policy and Resources Committee

The Local Plan was adopted in 2012 and does not reflect zero targets. However the draft Local Plan (Reg 19) - June 2021 does.
