Refusal Notice

Information concerning unsuccessful bidders is refused on the grounds that the disclosure of this information would prejudice or be likely to prejudice the commercial interests of the London Borough of Barnet and third-party organisations. Disclosure of this information would also be likely to make firms unwilling to participate in future exercises, thereby limiting our aim of achieving best value for money and the exemption in section 43 (2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) applies. This is a qualified or non-absolute exemption and the public interest test applies. The public interest in transparency in the spending of public money, in public money being used effectively and public authorities getting value for money and in procurement processes being conducted in an open and honest way has been considered. However, whilst there may be a public interest in access to this information, it is considered that in this case it is not in the wider public interest to disclose as there is a risk that the Council's bargaining position for the future will be prejudiced and / or commercial organisations may become reluctant to enter into discussions which could undermine the Council's ability to fulfil its role effectively. The same argument may apply as the third-party's commercial interests may be prejudiced, as it is arguably not in the public interest to hinder free and frank negotiations and tender processes generally.
