Thank you for your request received on 27 September 2021, for the following information:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from Barnet council.

We are looking at the number of planning permission applications made for basement conversions. A basement conversion application may include, but not limited to:

- Construction of a new basement conversion**
- Extension to an existing basement or cellar in a house**
- Making changes to an existing building, which require basement excavation**

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please may you provide me with:

- 1. The number of planning permissions for basement conversions from 2017-2021**
- 2. The number of declined planning permissions for basement conversions from 2017-2021**
- 3. The top 3 reasons for declined planning permissions for basement conversions from 2017 - 2021**

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.
