We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.

However, we believe that the exemptions detailed below apply to all of this information and this is withheld. Please see the Refusal Notice below.

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We consider that the qualified exemption set out in Section 31 (Law enforcement) subsection(1)(a) applies to the remaining information requested. Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

In applying this exemption, we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the interest in favour of disclosure.

Factors in favour of disclosure

- The council's commitment to openness and transparency. We confirm that there are currently 2,751 empty properties in the borough of Barnet
- There would be an interest to certain members of the public who wish to bring empty properties back into use
- It could be perceived as the Council retaining information and hiding behind legislation in order to do so
- Some local authorities may have disclosed similar information to that requested

Factors in favour of withholding

- There is a strong likelihood of releasing the details would result in criminal activity
- It is not in the public interest to increase the risks of crime
- Even if a significant number of local authorities have disclosed similar information to that requested in this case, it does not automatically follow that all public authorities should disclose that information

In all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.

The Empty Properties team may be able to put you in touch with owners who want to bring their empty properties back into use.

Section 40(2) - Personal data

We have withheld the names of the person(s) paying Council Tax by virtue of section 40 (2) and any discounts that apply under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), as disclosure of this information to the public generally, in the Council's view, would not be consistent with the data protection principle found in Article 5.1(a) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) lawfully, transparently and fairly.

We have considered whether disclosure is lawful and fair and whilst it may be lawful under Article 6.1(f) GDPR (legitimate interests) it would not be fair to the individuals concerned who would not expect the names of Council Tax payers to be disclosed as part of such a request.

The withheld information is exempt because disclosure would contravene the first data protection principle which requires that personal data is processed fairly and

lawfully. Disclosure of the requested information would breach this principle and in particular the requirement of fairness.
