We have processed this request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

#### Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.

Planning and Building Control are separate and entirely independent processes. They are concerned with different things and work off different legislation.

Unlike documents relating to Planning Applications, documents relating to Building Control Applications are not considered to be public by default. As such, unlike Planning Decision Notices, Building Control Completion Certificates are not available on the public facing Barnet Website.

Records relating to Building Control applications are only retained for 15 years.

While documents are only retained for 15 years, we do maintain a computerised index showing the outline details of Building Control cases received in the years 1990-present.

The London Borough of Barnet does not confirm details of Building Control Applications pre-dating 1990
