Thank you for your request received on 13 October 2021, for the following information:

have read the council's published formal delegated report for planning application ref: 17/5234/HSE and this states in the ninth paragraph of section 3 the following:

"This application would be largely retrospective, works appear to have been complete at the site."

The report confirms the planning officer (Name of officer redacted) visited the site on 21st September 2017, and as stated in her report she witnessed the development was complete at the time of her visit.

It is usual for planning officers to take photographs when they undertake site visits so I would ask that all photographs taken of the property by officers are forwarded onto me - I make this request under the Freedom of Information Act.

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.

However, we believe that the exceptions detailed below apply to all of this information and this is withheld. Please see the Refusal Notice below

R12(5)(b) The course of justice, fair trial or inquiry of a criminal or disciplinary nature

We consider that regulation 12(5)(b) (The course of justice) applies to the information requested because we consider that disclosure of the information requested would adversely affect the course of justice, the ability of a person to receive a fair trial or the ability of a public authority to conduct an inquiry of a criminal or disciplinary nature.

The information requested forms part of an enforcement appeal and the disclosure could prejudice the investigations



There is an open Enforcement appeal at this site and therefore the photos cannot be released because these proceedings are still ongoing, however the photos can be released at a later date, approximately by the end of March 2022, Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

In applying this exception, we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the interest in favour of disclosure.

Factors in favour of disclosure

To promote openness and transparency

The decision making processes of public functions should be transparent and open to scrutiny in order to inform the public debate.

Factors in favour of withholding

The disclosure of information in relation to enforcement and investigations, would compromise proceedings. In these circumstances of this case it is our view that the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.

Therefore we have decided to withhold the information.
