There is a suggestion that they want to knock down all the flats one purchased and then build 80 flats. 35% being affordable housing..

We have processed this request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Response

I can confirm that London Borough of Barnet holds the information you requested.

However, we believe that the exceptions detailed below apply to all of this information and this is withheld. Please see the Refusal Notice below.

R12(5)(e) Confidential commercial information

We consider that regulation 12 (5) (e) (Confidentiality of commercial or industrial information) applies to the information requested because we consider that disclosure of the information requested would adversely affect the confidentiality of commercial or industrial information where such confidentiality is provided by law to protect a legitimate economic interest.

Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.

Barnet Homes are not developing this site at the moment.

if any pre-application discussions are disclosed at this stage, it may prejudice the effective conduct of public affairs. This can be particularly relevant at the outset of major applications where a lot of exploratory discussion are still taking place.

The disclosure of this exploratory information is likely to prejudice the process of leading to a proper determination of any subsequent planning application submitted for the development of this site.



Factors in favour of disclosure

- The general proposition of maximizing openness that the EIR and the Council aspire to
- The benefits of ensuring transparent and accountable government by disclosing how the Council receives and spends public money;

Factors in favour of withholding

 Releasing the requested information could prejudice the Council's future negotiation capabilities and reduce the confidence third parties have with the Council in order to facilitate the decision making process. Both the Council and any third party contractor would be reluctant to have free and frank discussions if all that is discussed is subject to scrutiny with no safe space for 'confidential communications', the requested information may prejudice pending or future decisions which would be detrimental to the Council and or third parties.

In all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.

The public interest in withholding the requested information outweighs the public interest in disclosure of the requested information.

Therefore, we have decided to withhold the information.
