The contract is between Whittington Health who provide the Speech and Language Therapy service in Barnet (Children's Integrated Therapy service) and the Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) now the NCL Integrated Care Board and the LA makes a contribution to the contract value. The Service Level Agreement will need to be obtained from the CCG/ NCL Integrated Care Board.

10. What is the cost to the local authority of maintaining this service level agreement? Are speech and language therapy services under these contracts?

LA contribution to the contract is £600,000 which covers SLT, OT and PT (value to be finalised).

11. Please provide the standard maximum level of direct and indirect of speech and language therapy that is provided under the service level agreement for primary school.

There is no service level agreement for a maximum number of therapies. Barnet CIT offer a range of packages of care dependent on the young person's needs including Universal, Targeted and Specialist provision. The maximum package of care will depend on the child's need and what pathway they are on (Therapies are offered across 6 pathways). Bolt-on sessions can also be offered in all pathways in addition to core sessions when a specific clinical need arises for a specific purpose for a fixed period of time.

The level of SLT provision to a mainstream school is based dependent on the needs of the children attending the school with either an EHCP or with SLT needs without an EHCP - there is no average

If speech and language therapy to be delivered by an independent speech and language therapist has to be procured by the local authority, what is the hourly rate that the authority will offer (please provide it in monetary terms)? Would travel costs be additional? If so, how would they be calculated?

The hourly rate varies from £50 to £100 per hour depending on the private clinician commissioned. Travel costs may be additional or may be included, the funding agreement for these also vary depending on the time and distanced to be travelled.

Therapy to all Barnet state funded schools including Academies and Free schools is delivered by Barnet CIT, though the service does not have a specific SLA for each School.

The maximum package of care will depend on the child's need and what pathway they are on (Therapies are offered across 6 pathways). Bolt-on sessions can also

be offered in all pathways in addition to core sessions when a specific clinical need arises for a specific purpose for a fixed period of time.

The hourly rate varies from £75 to £100 per hour depending on the private clinician commissioned. Travel costs may be additional or may be included, the funding agreement for these also vary depending on the time and distanced to be travelled.

Therapy to all Barnet state funded schools including Academies and Free schools is delivered by Barnet CIT, though the service does not have a specific SLA for each School.
